On 07/02/2009 about 1542 hours I was dispatched to the lobby of the Tucumcari Police Dept. Tucumcari, NM. I met with Stacy Akin who told me her Daughter [REDACTED] had attacked her as she was trying to take [REDACTED] phone from her.

I saw three scratch marks on the left side of Ms. Akin's neck just above her collarbone. Ms Akin told me [REDACTED] hit her in the face a couple times causing her mouth to bleed.

Ms. Akin became unavailable.

On 2 July 2009 at approximately 15:42 hours dispatch advised me of a domestic situation in front of the police department. When I arrived at the station I met with Officer Denny Hill and Stacy Akin, the mother of [REDACTED] a fourteen-year-old female. Akin stated [REDACTED] had hit her and scratched neck her over a cell phone Stacy had taken away from [REDACTED]. Stacy said [REDACTED] was texting nasty things and sending "naughty" pictures over the phone to boys, some as old as twenty and that is why she was taking the phone away. Stacy had a visibly swollen lip and several scratches on the left side of her neck.

While speaking with Stacy, she said [REDACTED] had gotten into a fight with her father a few days before and in an argument with him the day prior to this incident. Stacy said she was from Amarillo and she was divorced from [REDACTED] father and there were issues there as well. Stacy said [REDACTED] ran away from her in front of the police department and the Fire Chief, Mike Cherry, told [REDACTED] to stop but she continued on.

I left the station and began searching the area and contacted JPO by telephone to advise them of the domestic battery and inquire as to what they wanted to do with the child when I found her. While on the phone, I saw [REDACTED] at Molinas Park and turned north on Monroe St. I advised JPO I was going to make contact with [REDACTED] and to hold on the phone until I could take custody of her.

I parked on the east side of the street and exited my vehicle as [REDACTED] was walking south out of the park. I came around the rear of my vehicle and approached [REDACTED] calling her by name and telling her to stop so I could talk to her. [REDACTED] yelled "no" and turned and ran north crossing in front of my vehicle towards the west across Monroe St. I gave chase yelling at her to stop. As I ran across Monroe St. I drew my Taser and again told her to stop or I would taze her. [REDACTED] continued running through the alley west of Molinas Park and started to turn north around a building I then activated my taser and struck [REDACTED] with both probes.

[REDACTED] immediately fell to the ground and I placed her in handcuffs. The top probe struck [REDACTED] in the base of the skull on the right side of her head and the bottom probe struck her in the left buttocks. [REDACTED] did not respond to verbal commands after the cycle and continued to show signs of electrical shock (ridged body) even after I removed the cartridge from the taser.

When I saw the probe lodged in [REDACTED] head I immediately notified dispatch to send an ambulance to my location for transport to Trigg for medical assistance. [REDACTED] began responding and cussing at me stating she hadn't done anything. [REDACTED] was not cooperative when the ambulance arrived and according to the ambulance personnel, continued to be combative until they arrived at Trigg.

I contacted dispatch and advised them to notify Akin, who was at the station, to meet us at Trigg. I escorted the ambulance and arrived just as the medics were opening the back door of the ambulance. [REDACTED] was still talking back and did not calm down until several minutes after arriving at the hospital.

Dr. Kester removed the probe from [REDACTED] hip and had x-rays taken of the one in her head. After reviewing the x-rays, Dr. Kester arranged transport to Albuquerque to have a neurosurgeon remove the probe in her head.

I contacted JPO Ron Reid and advised him of the medical situation and told him I would still prepare a Statement of Probable Cause and do a referral to JPO for the Domestic Battery and Evading.

[REDACTED] became very docile and compliant while at the hospital and made unsolicited statements about fighting with her mother and father. [REDACTED] also talked about her cousins and all the trouble they get in and said she figured she was going to prison too.

I took pictures of the probes and injuries (scratches to the face) [REDACTED] sustained when she fell after being tased. [REDACTED] stated one of the injury sites on her face was from a fight she had gotten into a few days earlier. [REDACTED] said she liked to fight and said that one time it took her mother and two other people to hold her down.

While at the hospital I again spoke with Stacy Akin and she advised me [REDACTED] had Epilepsy and was taking several medications. Stacy also advised that earlier [REDACTED] had gone over to someone's house and grabbed her little sister by the hair and drug her home. Stacy said [REDACTED] had gotten out of control and had been a problem lately.
